





# Follow these steps to sketch an outline of a head





# Task: Sketching the outline of a head

- Look in a mirror at the outline shape of your head and sketch it.
- Look at your hair line and sketch this on your head shape.
- Look at where your eyes are positioned. They are almost half way down from the top of your head!
- Draw one eye!
- Include the eyelid, eyelashes, pupil, iris and the effect of light if you can. Look at the slides for ideas on how to do this.
- Look in the mirror again and position the outline of your ears in the right place.

When you have drawn a sketch of your head, ears, hair and one eye:

Write your name around the eye where an eyebrow would go.

Once you have done this, add colour.

You can use any media to do this, such as coloured pencils or paints (if you have any).

Leave the background blank until the next lesson.
