

Can I understand and use ways to hook the reader?

This week we are going to be focusing on **narratives** - fictional stories.

When writing a story it is important that we grab the reader's attention and encourage the reader to read more. In this lesson, we are going to look at different ways of doing this - you might remember some of these skills as we go through the lesson!



Making sure we start our sentences in different ways e.g.Cautiously, The icy figure, Above me

Ways to hook the reader

Questions the character might ask themselves e.g. "Did anyone else know it was here?" Sam wondered. Including description so the reader can clearly imagine what they are reading about in their own head e.g. a giant tusk which had a sharp point at the end of it Today, we are going to write a gripping story starter about the picture below including the 'ways to hook the reader' skills discussed. Your paragraph should be 5-7 sentences long. **Remember:** you need to make your reader excited and left wanting to read more!
