Recap - what is an adverbial?

- It is a word or phrase that gives more information about the verb in the sentence (how/where/why/when the verb occurs).
- An adverbial can go at the start, middle or end of a sentence.
- The rest of the sentence must still make sense on it's own.

A reminder - example sentences that include adverbials

In the morning, Freya brushed her hair.

The adverbials are in red.

He tiptoed up the stairs quietly.

The lions slowly and carefully roamed the cage.
