When we looked at formal letters, we didn't use contractions as we needed a more formal tone.

In diaries, as we are mainly writing to ourselves, we can be a bit less formal. This means that we can use contractions.

I just **couldn't** believe my eyes! I **don't** think she realized how upset I was about it. I'll have to talk to her tomorrow.

When we use contractions, we drop out some letters from a word and replace them by an apostrophe. The apostrophe always goes where we removed the letters.
