## Expanded noun phrase

A phrase that tells you more about the noun. This doesn't just mean using an adjective beforehand.


E.g.

A small sheep with bright blue eyes.



Bright blue eyes which twinkle in the sunlight.

Soft, white wool which covers the lamb from head to toe.



Long ears that hang down to his shoulders.

Jet-black hooves which click rhythmically against the ground. You will be creating your own animal character, and describing them using expanded noun phrases.
