Some rules to remember:

- Questions always end with a question mark \rightarrow ?
- It's better to think of 2-3 really good questions than have loads of questions together.
- We usually put our questions **towards the end of the letter** (after we've shared our own news and stories).
- If you want someone to write you back, make sure you include your address at the top of the letter.
