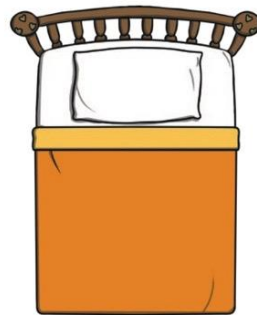

## Fast Five Possible answers

**Man:** pan, can, tan, fan, flan, span, ran, began, van, plan, Japan

**Bed:** red, fed, led, dead, fled, sped, tread, bread, bred, lead (metal),

**Bun:** fun, sun, run, nun, pun, spun, stun, done, begun, tonne.

In 'The Dragon Who Ate Our School' each stanza has 5 lines, and the end of each line rhymes using the same sound.

The day the dragon came to **call**  
she ate the gate, the playground **wall**  
and, slate by slate, the roof and **all**  
the staffroom, gym, and entrance **hall**  
and every classroom, big or **small**

**Your stanza will need to follow this rhyming and rhythm pattern.**
