

As you go through the slides, have a go at these techniques on a piece of paper and remember to label them.


The line technique

The line technique is the basic drawing instrument.

The line marks the outline of a motif.

It is used to represent the boundaries and the outline of objects.


Here is a typical example how to use the line as a drawing style:



Hatching technique


Different hatching techniques - from left to right:

Simple hatching, cross hatching in two directions, cross hatching in three directions



Smudging technique

When smudging, a hatched area is blurred using your finger
