Red

Complete the 'if, if, if, then' statements.

- 1) If the alarm had gone off on time, if she hadn't missed the bus, if there wasn't a traffic jam, then **she would not have been late.**
- 2) If the goalkeeper hadn't missed the ball, if the other team hadn't scored the last goal, if he'd passed the ball to a different player, then **they would never have lost the match.**
- 3) If Sam had stayed away from the abandoned house, if Toby had followed him when he ran, if he had looked back for his dog, then **Toby wouldn't be lost now.**
- 4) If they had ignored the lights, if the lights hadn't gone out, if Sam had stayed quiet when hiding, then **they wouldn't have been found.**
- 5) If she had taken a different route, if she had never driven over the bump in the road, if only she'd slowed down, then **her car wouldn't be broken now.**
- 6) If it didn't start raining, if he had left the house with his umbrella, if he had worn his wellington boots today, then **Sam wouldn't be soaking wet.**

Yellow

Various possible answers. An example is given below.

- 1) **If the goalkeeper hadn't missed the ball, if the other team hadn't scored the last goal, if he'd passed the ball to a different player,** then she would not have lost the game.
- 2) **If he'd have passed to a different player, if the other team weren't as good at defending, if he'd have knocked the ball away from the hoop,** then the other team wouldn't have scored that winning basket.
- 3) **If she had taken a different route, if she had followed the sat nav, if she hadn't listened to the strangers directions,** then she wouldn't be lost now.
- 4) **If they had ignored the lights, if the lights hadn't gone out, if Sam had stayed quiet when hiding,** then we wouldn't be in this mess.
- 5) **If Sam had stayed away from the abandoned house, if Toby had followed him when he ran, if he had looked back for his dog,** then he wouldn't have lost Toby.
- 6) **If she had taken a different route, if she had never driven over the bump in the road, if only she'd slowed down,** then her car wouldn't be broken.
- 7) **If she had decided what to wear sooner, if her brother hadn't lost the present, if her mum didn't get stuck in traffic,** then they would never have been late for the party.
