





How is this girl feeling?

### Let's look at an example!



What is this girl doing? She is feeling sad.

## How do we know that she is feeling sad?



#### How do we know that she is feeling sad?



- She is crying
- Her eyes are red
- Her face is scrunched up
- She's looking down

## If this character was in a book, there's two ways we could describe them.



We could tell the reader how she feels -

The girl is sad.

Or

We could show the reader how she feels -


The girl's eyes stung, as the hot tears swelled in her eyes. All of a sudden, she couldn't hide it anymore and she burst into tears.


Rather than saying 'the girl was scared', we can think about how we can *show* the reader this.
