Today we are going to be looking at pronouns.

Pronouns are words that replace a noun in a sentence.

You can only use them when you have used the noun before so the reader knows what you are talking about, for example:

Barney's tennis ball flew over the fence. He knew he would never get it back.

<u>'He'</u> and <u>'he'</u> are the pronouns referring to *Barney*.

<u>'it'</u> is the pronoun referring to the tennis ball.

Here are a few more examples that you would find in the same paragraph.

Holly desperately wanted to go back to school. She knew it would never get boring again.

<u>'She'</u> is the pronoun referring to *Holly*.

<u>'it'</u> is the pronoun referring to *school*.

Holly's mum sighed. "You'll go back there eventually," she said.



'You' is the pronoun referring to *Holly*.



'there' is the pronoun referring to school.

'she' is the pronoun referring to Holly's mum.

Pronouns can also be used for plurals.

The children in the garden were playing with a football in the garden when it started to rain. They ran inside quickly, leaving it out there.



<u>'They'</u> is the pronoun referring to the children.



<u>'it'</u> is the pronoun referring to *the football*.

'there' is the pronoun referring to the garden.

"Don't hurt <u>yourselves</u>," shouted their mother.



<u>'yourselves'</u> is the pronoun referring to the children.

In these sentences, identify the pronouns and what they are referring to.

<u>'They'</u> is the pronoun referring to *pupils*.

<u>'it'</u> is the pronoun referring to school uniform.

In summer, Miss Rolfe likes to eat a lot of ice cream. It helps to keep her cool when it's hot.

<u>'it'</u> is the pronoun referring to *ice cream*.

<u>'her'</u> is the pronoun referring to *Miss Rolfe*.
