Today we are going to be looking at possessive apostrophes.

Possessive apostrophes are used on nouns in sentences to show that something/someone belongs to something/someone else.

For example...

Barney's tennis ball flew over the fence.

The apostrophe used on the name before the s shows that the tennis ball belongs to Barney Possessive apostrophes are used in different ways within sentences.

The first way ...

We use an apostrophe and S ('s) to show that one person or thing owns or is a member of something.

For example ...

Finley's car was racing quickly around the track.

Possessive apostrophes are used in different ways within sentences.

The second way ...

We use an apostrophe after the "S" (s') at the end of a plural (more than one) noun to show belonging.

For example ...

The boys' ball bounced over the wall.

Possessive apostrophes are used in different ways within sentences.

The third way ...

If a plural noun doesn't end in "s" we add an apostrophe and then an "s" to show that something belongs to them.

For example ...

The children's bedrooms were all upstairs.
