
The ancient, rusty piano collected dust as it sat unused for years. On top of the piano, tattered sheets were scattered

Well done for remembering to punctuate the expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials! Be careful with your spellings!

Today you are going to get the chance to write a recount, but first let's recap what we have looked at this week!



We looked at pronouns!

Pronouns are words that replace a noun in a sentence.

You can only use them when you have used the noun before so the reader knows what you are talking about, for example:

Barney's tennis ball flew over the fence. He knew he would never get it back.

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<u>'He'</u> and <u>'he'</u> are the pronouns referring to *Barney*.

<u>'it'</u> is the pronoun referring to the tennis ball.

We looked at past tense verbs! Remember there are some exceptions to the '-ed' rule.

Past tense verbs usually end with 'ed'. This shows that the action happened already - in the past.

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Examples:
jumped,
sprinted,
climbed,
spied (here the 'y' became an 'i': spy - spied)
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see - saw, swim - swam, bring - bought, drive - drove, is - was, have - had

We looked at possessive apostrophes!

Possessive apostrophes are used on nouns in sentences to show that something/someone belongs to something/someone else.

For example...

Barney's tennis ball flew over the fence.

The apostrophe used on the name before the s shows that the tennis ball belongs to Barney

The learning we have done this week will all help you to write the best recount possible.
