This week you are going to write a letter to the school.


It will tell us:

- What you would like to do once this is all over.
- Where you would like to go once this is all over.

To be able to write a letter, we need to know the structure of one.

This is the structure of a letter:

Layout



Imagine you are writing a letter to school.

First, you start with your address and the date Miss Rolfe you write the letter. This always goes on the 487 Fake Street right-hand side of the page. Sillychester SL87 9H0 Monday 18th May 2020

Next, you write the **name** and **address of the person receiving your letter**. This always goes on the **left-hand side** of the page.

Miss Forge Monkwick Junior School School Road Colchester CO2 8NN Dear Miss Forge,

After that, you write a **greeting** to the person you are writing to.

Then, you write the **main body** of your letter. This will be the longest part of your writing.

Remember you will write about 2 things:

- What you would like to do when this situation ends.
- Where you would like to go when this situation ends.

Dear Miss Forge,

back to school. It was fun at first but now I'm extremely bored at home and I prefer to teach lessons at school! I miss my class and I'm looking forward to hearing about what they've been up to. I wonder if they have learnt how to bake or maybe how to knit?

When we are allowed to, I would like to go

When the lockdown ends, I can't wait to go

When we are allowed to, I would like to go and see my nan at her house. She's 83 years old so she isn't able to go shopping or go for exercise. I can't wait until I can hug her or take her out to the countryside. The countryside is her favourite place because it is where she used to go as a child.

Finally, you will sign off you letter with a closing farewell (goodbye) and your name.

The most common way of ending a letter is to say yours sincerely.
