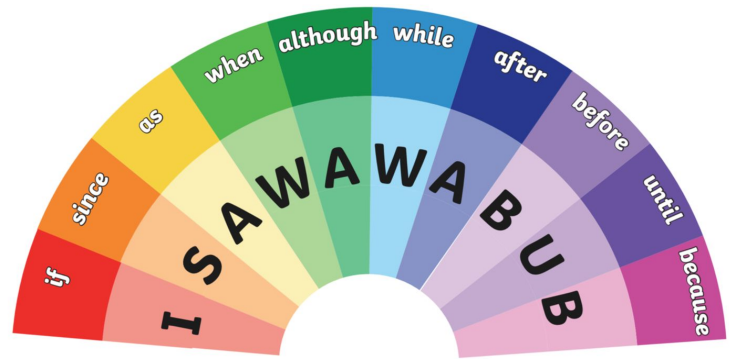


Red
