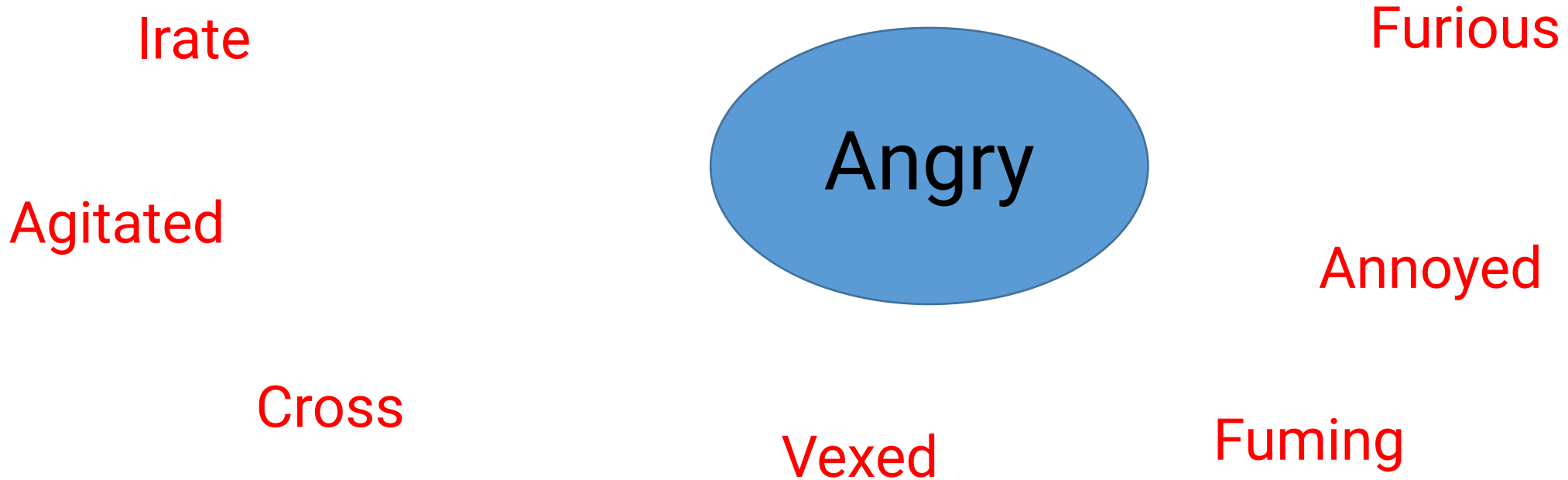

Trickling quickly, the rain **splashed** into the lake.
