Geographical Maps


Have a look at these maps and think about what key information it tells us about physical features, human features and settlements.

Human features - Aspects that will impact on humans, that are mainly man made, for example transport, shops.

Physical features - Aspects that discuss the land, water sources, climate.


Settlement - where people live, therefore physical and human features all impact on whether people decided to live in a particular area.

Unlike Australia, India is not located in the middle of the ocean. Australia stands alone and is not joined geographically with any other countries. Whereas India is joined to countries such as China, Pakistan, Nepal. Whilst also have a large coastline.




Rivers

India may be so highly populated due to the high level of water sources. You can see the amount of the blue lines traveling through India, which means there are many areas to grow crops and access water.




Mountains

The ideal altitude is between 0-150 any more or less it becomes difficult and more challenging to live in places that are much higher up. As you can see the most populated areas are between the 0-150 scale but where we know to be less populated they experience very high altitude which can be dangerous to your health



Transport

Due to India being so highly populated there needs to be lots of transport links they a large percentage of these are railways. The areas that we know as less populated clearly have limited transport links. Think about how transport links impact on employment.
