Can I use adverbials of time?

Fast Five

Find the verb, adjective, adverb, preposition and adverbial in this extract.

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What are adverbials of time?

Adverbials of time use words or phrases to help the reader understand when something is occurring.

In an explanation text they sequence when things are going to happen.

Adverbials of time

Can you identify any of these adverbials of time in the model text?

Firstly, the aviator puts four nylon poles into sockets located at the top of the basket. Then, they carefully place the burner on top of the poles. Next, she connects the cables to the burner frame - the cables also go under the basket in order to hold everything together.

After this, she connects the hoses from the full gas tanks to the burner – this allows it to be tested.

Next, two people hold the mouth of the bubble open (it takes two people because of its large size) while it is filled with cold air from the fan. This process is completed until the material becomes rounded and stretched.

Adverbials of time in the model text

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Instructions are written chronologically.

We can use adverbials of time to help the reader understand the order in which things have to be done.

Example:

The first thing you should do when you get to school is walk through the gates. Next, when you get into the playground, you should line up in a straight line. Walk to your classroom following your teacher. Before you sit down, you need to take off your coat and get your reading book. After everyone has selected their lunch and sat down, the teacher will take the register.

Possible Answers

To begin with, the hen makes a nest for her eggs. Each day, the hen lays one egg in her nest. After ten days, there are ten eggs in the nest. This is called a clutch of eggs.

At this stage, the hen sits on her eggs to keep them warm. Inside each egg, a chick will soon begin to grow. If the eggs get cold, the chicks will die. During the incubation period, the eggs are turned so that they will be warm all over.

After 21 days, the chick is fully-developed and ready to hatch from the sack that protects the egg. Not long after, the chick uses its egg tooth to tap the shell. If the chick is unable to tap the shell, it will not hatch. Soon it makes a tiny hole in the shell.

At last, the shell breaks open and the chick comes out of the eggshell. If it is wet and very tired, it lies down to rest. Within a few hours, the chick can stand up and run about provided that it is not injured.

Now it is soft and fluffy and ready to feed.
