RED TASK

Rewrite the sentences adding an appropriate adverb.

1. April **cheerfully/happily/politely** greeted Mark each morning.
2. Kristen **briskly/quickly/rapidly** walked to the library, eager to complete her homework.
3. She dances **weirdly/strangely/abnormally**, but her quirky nature is what I like best about her.
4. Susan sang **loudly/noisily/deafeningly** every morning before school.
5. The cat stalked the mouse **silently/quietly**.

YELLOW TASK:

1. Mrs Smith **carefully** ironed her new blouse.
2. The picture that was hanging in the hallway was **beautifully/splendidly** painted by a talented local artist.
3. James ran home **quickly/rapidly** as it was raining hard.
4. Whenever you stroke my cat, he purrs **loudly/contentedly**
