Geography


- Russia is a huge country that is double the size of Australia. The vast country is located in part on the European continent and on the Asian continent.
- Almost half of the country is covered in forests, only 14% are suitable for agricultural land due to the harsh climate.
- The climate ranges from steppe in the South to subarctic in Siberia and tundra in the polar North.



Map of Russia






Facts About Russia

- Capital: Moscow.
- **Population**: 149,476,000.
- President: Vladimir Putin
- Language: Russian
- Literacy: More than 99% can read and write.
- Religion: Russian-Orthodox 20%, Muslim 15%, Christians 2%, many Russians are non-believers
- Currency: 1 Ruble=100 kopeka
- National Holiday: 12 June (Russia Day)
- History: The Russian Federation was created on 25 December 1991
- National symbols: national anthem, coat of arms and national flag (white - blue - red). National animals: bear and the double-headed eagle. National flower: camomile

Moscow

- Moscow is the capital city of Russia.11.5 million people live there, so it is Europe's biggest city. It is also the seventh biggest city in the world. Moscow is an important political, cultural, economic, religious, financial and transportation centre.
- The middle of the city is an ancient walled city called the Kremlin. There are important government buildings, museums and churches in the Kremlin. Many of the buildings in Moscow, like St Basil's Cathedral and Spasskaya Tower, are very beautiful and famous. There are also modern buildings. The many art galleries have big collections.



Siberia

- Siberia is a large region spanning much of Eurasia and North Asia. It is part of Modern Russia.
- The territory of Siberia is harsh. It has a huge area of 13.1 million square kilometres (5,100,000 sq mi), Siberia accounts for 77% of Russia's land area. However, it is home to approximately 36 million people—27% of the country's population. This is equivalent of about out 3 people per square kilometre. This makes Siberia one of the most sparsely populated regions on Earth.
- Worldwide, Siberia is well known primarily for its long, harsh winters, with a January average of −25 °C.
- The average temperature does not get above 10 C which is the same as a mild winter day in the UK.
