Passive Voice

Passive voice lets us use the object of the action as the subject of the sentence.

The dog bit me. (active voice)

I was bitten by the dog. (passive voice)

Look at these examples

Bees make honey. (Active)

Honey is made by bees. (Passive)

The sun warmed and dried him. (Active)

He was warmed and dried by the sun. (Passive)

REMEMBER

- •The subject comes before the verb in active sentences. The subject does the action.
- •The action is done by an agent in passive sentences. The action is done to the subject.
- •The words 'was', 'were' and 'by' are usually in a passive sentence.
- Active sentences are usually shorter.
