In an attempt to improve China's economy, Mao introduced a focus on grain and steel production. Widespread famine saw a large amount of deaths which reduced China's population size. Backyard furnaces were set up to produce steel: people were forced to move homes to work on this. Most of the steel produced was useless and this made conditions worse for China's economy.
